"ROAD RAGE!"

As you already know, the holidays can be a happy and exciting time, but there are times when the holiday can cause it's own stress.

Most of us have become angry behind the wheel of an automobile. But, there are few of us that choose to act on their anger behind the wheel leading themselves into hostile, aggressive or even lethal action.



Remember a vehicle is not only a means of transportation, but can be at times considered a weapon. One of the most important ways to avoid "Road Rage" is to avoid confrontation. Don't instigate or aggravate someone by doing things to get back at them or provoke them.

WAYS TO AVOID ROAD RAGE...

Avoid aggressive driving.

DO NOT use obscene gestures, faces, or stares.

DO NOT cut off other drivers.

Use your turn signals.

DO NOT tailgate.

Let vehicle's pass you if you're driving the speed limit and another vehicle is tailgating you.

Drive the posted speed limit.

Give yourself extra time when traveling somewhere.

Don't drive angry.



Use common sense courtesy.

Take a moment to cool down and not think everyone else is stupid and should drive like you. We have differences for different reasons. Realize this.

WHAT TO DO IF CONFRONTED...

Always leave enough room between you and the vehicle in front of you if you need to escape a physical attack.

Look for alternate driving routes to get away from someone trying to confront you.

Ignore any obscene gestures.

Do not "tap" your brakes to aggravate someone who is tailgating-move over or pull off the road safely and allow them to pass.

Do not follow them after they've passed.

If you feel you are being threatened try to go to a highly populated public area to ask for help.

Call 911. Know where you are, a description of the "Road Rage" driver and direction of travel. Remember, 911 goes to the State Police first and then to the local police. where you are.

PROTECT AGAINST “HOME INVASION”

With the recent arrest of Suspects responsible for multiple Home Invasions, I would like to take this time to remind us on how to reduce our chances of becoming victim to this crime. Here are some short simple tips to remember:

Check Window Security and locks.

Check Door Security and locks.

Check garage Doors and locks.

Do you leave outside lights on? Front and Back?

Will you keep the shrubbery and landscaping at a level where neighbors can see around your home?

Do you ALWAYS lock the doors and secure windows when you leave, even for a short time?

Are ALL you outside leading doors solid wood or metal?

Do you have lock throws that lead at least 1” into the door-frame?

Is your door frame protected by a sufficient strike plate?

Can you and do you lock your garage door?

Have you photographed and recorded your valuable items?

Are they marked by Operation ID?

Do you place yourself on the Police Department’s “Vacation Watch” List?



Dogs do NOT always act as a deterrent.

Alarms DO NOT always act as a deterrent, but DO help when audible to alert neighbors.

If someone knocks on your door, speak to them from behind a locked door and if suspicious, contact Police immediately.
