How Are Your Taxes Divided?

As indicated below, the City collects your taxes, but most of the taxes you pay go to other organizations. The City receives 1/3 of your taxes to manage all City services, including police and fire. The Garden City School District receives 1/3, with the remaining taxes going to Wayne County, the Garden City Library, Schoolcraft College, and other authorities. When the City collects your taxes, the money doesn't just go to the City. Almost 68% of your taxes is actually sent off to many other organizations.
